- Three main concepts: the web, a web page and a web site
 - The World Wide Web, also called the Web, is a worldwide collection of electronic documents
 - A web page is a document on the WWW
 - A web site is a collection of related Web pages

Web Client – Server System

- A web client-server system contains a web client and a web server:
 - A Web client sends HTTP requests to a web server, then reads HTML documents and display
 - A Web server receives requests from a web client and sends HTTP responses (usually an html document) to a web client

HTTP Request and Response



 HTTP (Hypertext Transfer Protocol): is a set of rules governing the format and content of the conversation between a web client and a web server

URL (Uniform Resource Locator): a string representing the location of a Web page



• Home page: the Web page considered as the "start point" for a Web site



• Hyperlink: the pointer from a Web page to another



• Tab browsing: allow users to surf and view multiple web pages on a single window



- A search engine: is a system designed to search information on the WWW
