3. COURSE DESCRIPTION			

This course serves as a required condition for students for speaking course. Only those who complete all course requirements are qualified to take part in the end-of-the-semester examination.

This course is designed to mainly to help students to standardize their pronunciation by mainly self studying at home after having time practising some sounds in classroom hours. The focus of the course is pronunciation for listening and speaking, including receptive and productive practice. In-class activities, including dialogues and pair-work, will help students to give guidance and immediate feedback from teachers to overcome specific pronunciation difficulties. Home practice is desired to double the in-class hour to achieve the desirable progress.

The course progresses from individual sounds, through sequences of sounds, and stress in words, to intonation patterns and sentences.

The course adopts the incremental approach, learning by doing and learner-centered approach. Students are expected to demonstrate clear progresses on one thing at a time.

4. COURSE OBJECTIVES

By the end of the course, by the end of the course, students are able to:

- 1. familiarise themselves with the phonemic chart
- 2. achieve a high level of understanding with their speaking ability
- 3. become familiar with a foreign cultural experience and gain an insight to customs in a foreign environment.
- 4. gain a pragmatic view about what they will expect once overseas in an English speaking surroundings
- 5. understand body and facial communication such as expressions of happiness and anger which will help them while conversing to native speakers.
- 6. gain confidence to speak to fellow students in English as well as native speakers
- accustom to accents, which in turn may aid them to understand the main points of a lecture or talk, provided that the subject matter is familiar and the presentation is straightforward and clearly structured.
- 8. listen for clues and make inferences from what has been heard
- 9. follow and create extended conversations between native speakers on familiar topics. They will be able to stress and intonation to an optimum level while in conversations.

ASSESSMENT TASKS

PROJECT 1: MINI PRESENTATION

This activity is to keep track of students' continuous work and progress in pronunciation practice. Due to USTH learning themes, the students are encouraged to present the science-related topics from the course of "Introduction to Science in English". Teachers of Pronunciation are strongly recommended to encourage your students to interweave science contents in all projects.

- Every week students will prepare a one to two minute presentation to answer assigned questions (as the homework every week). Students will need to prepare written scripts [i.e.

portfolio-form provided below] before in-class oral reports. Then he/ she will deliver in front of the class.

- Students will be assessed based on the features of pronunciation that they have learnt in previous weeks.

- Each week 4-5 students are called randomly to deliver their presentations. Teacher does not inform which students to present in the following week. All students have to prepare the scripts and wait for their turns.

- At the end of the course, students submit to teachers their writing at home for teachers' records of their homework completion.

- Each student will have to present twice during the course.

PROJECT 2: PRONUNCIATION SHOWCASE

This activity is filmed for further feedback

This activity is to assess:

- students' pronunciation accuracy and other aspects such as fluency and intonation
- students' ability to use real-life English language, and
- the ability to co-operate in group performances

How to conduct a pronunciation showcase

- The class will be divided into groups of 2-4. Each group will cut 1 or 2 short pieces with each lasting for 6-8 minutes from 2 different movies/talk shows from CNN or BCC, CNBC or any authentic television channels. There would be enough characters for 2-4 members of the group. If there is not enough numbers of characters for the each member to perform, the students can divide the time of speaking among each other. Also, the amount of time for each member to speak must be equal. The minimum talking time of each student in the showcase should be 4 minutes altogether.
- You need to submit the first pieces in **week 4** and the second in **week 6**.
- The group is highly recommended to use the movies whose transcripts can be found online. You need to download the transcripts and practice speaking and pronouncing as the characters speak.
- After that, all groups will act out the transcript in front of the class. The transcript of each group
 must be printed out and delivered to the class before show time. Also, all groups must bring
 good recorders/camera to record the pronunciation so that the teacher can have a look at the
 performance again at home to assess pronunciation if necessary.
- Students are encourage to dress up like the characters in the clips (Bonus points)
